



From the Desk of the City Manager

You may have noticed two new monitors installed on the wall in the second floor lobby in City Hall. These monitors are part of the new virtual queuing system being installed by the Department of Development Services in partnership with our IT Department. This new system will allow customers to join a virtual queue online to meet with plans examiners and other disciplines within Development services. They can do this by mobile phone, website or through on-site kiosks that will be located in the second floor lobby area. Once signed in, QLess provided status updates by text or voice message and notifies customers when their turn is approaching. We believe this will be an important customer service enhancement within Development Services and it should be fully operational within the next several weeks.

Improvements to Henry Graham Park in the Liberia neighborhood are moving along and the park is expected to be completed in the next few weeks. While the park will open to the community once it's ready, we'll be scheduling an official grand opening celebration for the newly improved park in September just after the Commission returns from its scheduled summer recess at the end of August. The newly renovated park, located at 2350 Simms Street, includes new fencing and entrance gates, natural and colored concrete walkways and pads, new children's playground equipment, a children's water feature and splash pad, park benches, a picnic area, a game table, waste bins, a drinking fountain, exercise equipment, solar lighting and new landscaping, sod, irrigation and signage.

The City's Planning and Economic Development staff hosted a State Road 7/US 441 Transit Oriented Corridor (TOC) Rezoning Meeting for the business community in the area and real estate representatives on this morning at Metro Signs, located at 1220 South State Road 7. Planning staff reviewed the proposed zoning regulations with area businesses. This meeting will be followed by a City Commission Workshop on Tuesday, June 27th at 11:00 a.m. at City Hall, 2600 Hollywood Boulevard in Room 215. The Planning staff will review the proposed zoning regulations with the City Commission. As with all workshops, the public is invited to attend. The goal would be to have these recommendations come before the Planning and Development Board and then the Commission for a first reading as soon as feasible after the summer commission recess.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), in partnership with the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) and the City, will host a Hollywood Boulevard Complete Street Open House Thursday, June 22nd at 5:00 p.m. at City Hall, 2600 Hollywood Boulevard in the 2nd Floor Lobby. The FDOT has outreached to all of the businesses and property owners along Hollywood Boulevard to attend this open house. Project plans for the MPO's flagship Complete Streets Project will be on display and FDOT, MPO and City staff will be available to discuss the construction plans, answer questions and address individual concerns. 
