### From the Desk of the City Manager



Debris Management Contractors are on schedule to finish the final pass of Hurricane Irma storm debris removal by December 16<sup>th</sup>. Less than 10,000 cubic yards of debris remains in alleyways City-wide. Crews are also finishing with tree stump removal and backfilling holes. Last week I announced the return of the regular weekly commingled collection. Property owners who have alleyways should now be placing their garbage and recycling carts, as well as their commingled items in the alley for collection. We recognize illegal dumping still remains a challenge in our City, if you

see someone dumping debris in your neighborhood Hollywood Police advise you to not engage with the individual, but instead call the police non-emergency number at 954.764.HELP (4357) and ask to have an officer dispatched. A vehicle description and license plate information is helpful for their investigation.

Department of Public Works crews and contractors are installing new, lighted LED garland with bows on street lights along Hollywood Boulevard from US-441 to A1A. After years of use and exposure to the elements during the holiday season, the old snowflake and shooting star décor could no longer be safely used. The new garland and bow LED decorations were able to be purchased quickly to provide an immediate replacement and offer a consistent, complimentary look to the existing decorations found in downtown Hollywood and along Hollywood Beach.

The City's Public Works Department is aware that some individual poles or spans of poles are not currently lit. Those areas are dark due to ongoing construction taking place on the Boulevard, as well as non-functioning poles that sustained damage during Hurricane Irma. Due to the extensive damage, it initially appeared as though no holiday decorations or lights would be possible, but I am happy to report staff has been working closely with Florida Power and Light to allow for the installation and illumination of the decorations.

I would like to thank everyone who took the time to visit with Treasure Coast Regional Planning Council architects during this week-long Design Studio Charrette and Design Workshop last weekend. Ideas, thoughts and suggestions gathered from these community meetings will now be considered for inclusion in the Station Area Master Plan for the proposed train station and area around the FEC Railway Tracks in Downtown Hollywood.

This planning process is the next step in anticipation of the Tri-Rail Coastal Link commuter train system connecting eastern coastal cities from Miami to Jupiter using existing Florida East Coast (FEC) rail tracks. A "Work in Progress" presentation will be held on Monday, December 11<sup>th</sup> at City Hall, room 219 at 1:30 p.m. to review the status of



the plan to date.

A planned closure of Sheridan Street at State Road 7 is scheduled for Friday, December 8<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 p.m. through Monday, December 11<sup>th</sup>, at 5:00 a.m. This necessary closure is to allow Florida Department of Transportation contractors to install new drainage and water main infrastructure in the area as part of the US441/SR7 Improvement Project. Motorists are being asked to seek an alternate route to avoid construction delays. We very much appreciate the public's patience with this project. The good news is that we're closing in on the finish line with the nearly 3 year project slated to be done in 2018.



On-street metered parking began this past Monday in an effort to improve the availability of customer parking closer to business entrances. I have heard concerns from residents who took the time to email me and post to the City's social media sites. Evaluations will take over the next several months to monitor the impact on area businesses.

Finally, as this is my last weekly message of 2017, I would like to take the opportunity to wish everyone a joyful, safe and happy holiday season. I am very much looking forward to a 2018 filled with new accomplishments, outstanding achievements, and continued progress with a purpose in the City of Hollywood.

## **QUIPS**

### **Florida Department of Transportation**

Sheridan Street will be closed at SR 7 beginning Friday, December 8<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 p.m. through Monday, December 11<sup>th</sup> at 5:00 a.m. for drainage and water main installations. Motorists driving westbound on Sheridan Street will be detoured via SR 7, Stirling Road and NW 68<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Motorist traveling eastbound will be detoured via NW 64 Avenue, Taft Street and northbound SR 7. \*Weather Permitting\*

### **Water Main Replacement Program**

#### **Davie Road Extension, from N. 72<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, south to University Drive**

Crews are on site installing approximately 6,600 LF of 12 in. water main and restoring pavement along the east side of Davie Road Extension, from the intersection of N. 72<sup>nd</sup> Avenue, south towards University Drive. A traffic plan is in place and traffic is being redirected accordingly.

#### **Hollywood Boulevard to Sheridan Street from US1 to the Intracoastal**

Curb repair is being done south of Johnson Street, between 12<sup>th</sup> Avenue and 9<sup>th</sup> Avenue. Alleyways are being cleaned up. Johnson Street is being prepared for final resurfacing. Traffic plan is in place and traffic is being redirected accordingly.

#### **Johnson Street to Taft Street from N. 66<sup>th</sup> Avenue to N. 74<sup>th</sup> Terrace**

Water services are being installed on private property. No road closures are scheduled.

## **INFLOW / INFILTRATION REDUCTION PROGRAM**

#### **Hollywood Boulevard to Johnson Street from N. 64<sup>th</sup> Avenue to N. 72<sup>nd</sup> Avenue**

Crews are on site installing CIPP for approximately three weeks. Traffic impacts will be minimized as much as possible.

#### **Johnson Street to Arthur Street from N. 64<sup>th</sup> Avenue to N. 67<sup>th</sup> Avenue**

Crews are on site installing CIPP for approximately three weeks. Traffic impacts will be minimized as much as possible.

#### **McKinley Street from N. 67<sup>th</sup> Avenue to N. 72<sup>nd</sup> Avenue**

Crews are on site installing new manholes for approximately one month. Traffic impacts will be minimized as much as possible.

#### **Sheridan Street to Stirling Road from 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue to 46<sup>th</sup> Avenue**


Crews are on site monitoring sewer mains for approximately three weeks. Traffic impacts will be minimized as much as possible.
